On January 2, 2014, the Monroe Catholic schools lost a longtime friend and steward of Catholic education, Bob Beaubien. As many of you know, Bob worked as a maintenance man for St. Mary Parish/School and later for SMCC. He was a member of St. Mary Parish.

To say Bob was a friend of Catholic education is an understatement. He was a quiet leader of the St. Mary parish school community, keeping the school in pristine condition and greeting the children by name every day. He was at St. Mary day and night; fixing, cleaning and keeping an eye out for all of us. He was an unsung hero doing his tasks with a smile and caring for the small and large projects one and the same. When Bob was first diagnosed, the children of St. Mary School held fundraisers for "Mr. Bob" who they all loved so much.

The Bob Beaubien scholarship will be awarded annually to a MCES student whose family is a parishioner of St. Mary. Bob was the youngest of four children born to Victor and Priscilla Beaubien. He was a 1980 graduate of Monroe Catholic Central. He was 51 years old and is survived by his three siblings: Mark J Beaubien (MCC, 1974) of Monroe, Sue Beaubien-Gale (SMA, 1966) of Clarkston and Mary Kaye Yonovitz (SMA, 1968) of Ann Arbor.

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
